



## ത്തുളിത് ക്വൽ

அன்பிற்கும், பாசத்திற்கும் சொந்தமான என் அன்பு அன்னையர்களே, சகோதரிகளே, உங்கள் அனைவருக்கும் நம் ஆண்டவர் இயேசு கிறிஸ்துவின் உயிர்ப்பு பெருவிழா வாழ்த்துக்களும் மற்றும் அவரின் அமைதி நிறைந்த சமாதானமும் உரித்தாகுக.

இயேசு உயிர்க்கும் வரை மறைநூல் உண்மையை சீடர்கள் கூட நம்பவில்லை. அவரது கல்லறையை அதிகாலையில் தரிசிக்க சென்ற மகதலா மரியா கல்லறையின் கல் புரட்டப்பட்டிருப்பதை பார்த்த முதல் சாட்சி. பயந்து ஒளிந்து கொண்ட சீடர்களிடம்,

மகதலா மரியா சொல்லும் செய்தி வலுவுள்ள நம்பிக்கையாய் பிறப்பெடுக்கிறது. பேதுரு, யோவான் விரைந்து செல்கின்றனர். இளையவர், முதியவருக்காக காத்திருக்கின்றார். மூத்தோர் சொல் நெல்லிக் கனி போன்றது என்பதை எல்லோரும் உணர்ந்திட செய்கின்றார் யோவான். அவர்கள் கண்டது "வெற்றுக் கல்லறை" இது சொல்லும் செய்தி கல்லறையில் அடக்கம் செய்யப்பட்ட இயேசு உயிர்த்துவிட்டார்.

மகதலா மரியா கல்லறைக்கு வெளியே நின்று தொடர்ந்து அழுது கொண்டிருக்கிறார். உயிர்த்த ஆண்டவர் இயேசு கிறிஸ்து மரியாவை ஏனம்மா அழுகிறாய்? யாரைத் தேடுகிறாய்? என்று கேட்க மரியாளோ இயேசுவை தோட்டக்காரர் என்றெண்ணி புலம்பிய போது, "மரியா" என்று வழக்கமான சொல்லாடலை இயேசு பயன்படுத்த "ரபுனி" என்று இயேசு கிறிஸ்து ஆண்டவரை பற்றிக் கொள்ள எத்தனிக்கின்றார் மரியா, உடனே இயேசு என்னை இப்படி பற்றிக் கொள்ளாதே. உனக்கு ஒரு பணி உண்டு. நீ போய் என் சகோதரர்களிடம் சென்று என் தந்தையும், உங்கள் தந்தையும் என் கடவுளும் உங்கள் கடவுளுமானவரிடம் நான் செல்லவிருக்கிறேன் எனச் சொல் என்று திருத்தூது பணியை செய்யப் பணிக்கிறார். இயேசுவால் உலகிற்கு அறிமுகப்படுத்தப்பட்ட முதல் பெண் சீடத்தி மகதலா மரியா என்றால் அது மிகையாகாது.

சாவு வீழ்ந்தது, வெற்றி கிடைத்தது என்று கூறி இயேசுவின் உயிர்ப்பை மனமகிழ்வுடன் கொண்டாடுவது தான் உயிர்ப்பு பெருவிழா. உண்மையை உறங்க வைக்கவும் முடியாது, நீதியை சாகடிக்கவும் இயலாது, உண்மைக்கு உயிர் உண்டு, நீதிக்கு வாழ்வுண்டு.

இயேசுவின் உயிர்ப்பு நம்மை சவாலான வாழ்வை எதிர்6காள்ள அழைக்கிறது. இயேசுவின் உயிர்ப்பு, விடுதலை வாழ்வுக்கு வழி காட்டி நிற்கிறது. சாதாரண மனிதர்களைப் போல் பயந்து, அச்சம் கொண்டிருந்தவர்கள், பூட்டின அறையை விட்டு வெளியே வந்தனர், இயேசு கிறிஸ்து ஆண்டவர் என்று உரக்கச் சொல்லி, அவர் சொன்னபடி உயிர்த்தெழுந்தார் என்று வல்லமையோடு சான்று பகர்ந்தனர். சவால்களை துணிவோடு எதிர்கொள்வதற்கும், துன்பங்களில் கரைந்து, மறைந்து போகாமல் தாங்கி வாழ்வதற்கும், ஒளிவிளக்காய் இயேசு தங்களோடு இருக்கின்றார் என்பதை சென்றவிடமெல்லாம் பறை சாற்றி வந்தனர். பொய்மையும், அநீதியும் நம் வாழ்வில் தடைகளாகக் குறுக்கிட்டாலும் இறுதியில் அவை ஒன்றுமில்லாமல் போய்விடும். இயேசு கிறிஸ்து 33 ஆண்டுகள் இம்மண்ணில் நன்மைகள் மட்டுமே செய்து வாழ்ந்தார். சமூகத்தில் அநீதிகளுக்கு எதிராக குரல் கொடுத்தார். தவறுகளை கண்டித்தார். எல்லோரும் சமம் என்று, சமத்துவத்தை வலியுறுத்தினார். மனித நேயத்துடன் வாழ்வதற்கு பல்வேறு போதனைகளை எடுத்தியம்பினார். போதித்ததை வாழ்ந்தார், வாழ்ந்ததை போதித்தார். இவைகளை கண்ணுற்ற பரிசேயர், சதுசேயர், மதத்தலைவர்கள், உரோமை ஆட்சியாளர்கள் இயேசுவை கொன்றுவிட்டால் எல்லாம் முடிந்து போகும் என எண்ணி மரண தண்டனையை அளித்தார்கள். ஆனால் அவர்களின் எண்ணம் பொய்த்துப் போனது. இயேசு இறந்து, மாற்றான் கல்லறையில் புதைக்கப்பட்டு, மூன்றாம் நாள் உயிர்த்தெழுந்தவுடன் தான் முன்பை விட வீரியமாய் கிறிஸ்தவம் தழைத்தோங்கியது. மண்ணில் புதைக்கப்பட்ட விதை மண்ணை பிளந்து முளை வந்து செழித்தோங்கிய மரமாய் ஆனது போல இயேசுவின் உயிர்ப்புக்கு பின் கிறிஸ்தவம் செழித்தோங்கியது.

சகோதரிகளே! நன்மைக்காக, உண்மைக்காக, நாம் உழைக்கும் போதெல்லாம் அநீதிக்கெதிராக குரல் கொடுக்கும் போதெல்லாம் சமூகத்தில் அவல நிலையில் உள்ளவர்களுக்காகவும், ஒடுக்கப்பட்டவர்களுக்காகவும் குரல் எழுப்பும் போதெல்லாம் நாமும் அநீத தீர்ப்பு எழுதப்பட்டு சாகடிக்கப்படுகிறோம், நமது குரல்வளையும் நெரிக்கப்படுகிறது. ஆனால் இயேசுவுக்கு "உயிர்ப்பு" நிகழ்ந்தது போல், நாமும் தீமைக்கெதிராக கிளர்ந்தெழும் போதெல்லாம் கிறிஸ்துவின் உயிர்ப்பு அனுபவத்தை பெற்றவர்களாகிறோம்.

நாம் உயிர்ப்பின் மகிழ்வில் திளைக்க நம் மனக்கல்லறைக்கான கல் புரட்டப்பட வேண்டும். இக்கல்லை புரட்டிப் போடுபவர்கள் உண்மையிலேயே நமது நலம் விரும்பிகள், நம் சபை பொறுப்பாளர்கள், நமது சபை சட்டங்கள், வழிநூல்களின் வழிகாட்டல்கள், பேரவையின் தீர்மானங்கள், இல்லத்தலைவிகள் பெரியோர், உருவாக்குனர்கள், வழிகாட்டிகள் என பலர். இவர்களால் நம் மனதின் கடினமான கல்லறைக் கல் அவ்வப்போது திறக்கப்படுவதுண்டு. இதை உணர்ந்து நம் பழைய வாழ்வுக்கும், தீய வாழ்வுக்கும் தீய எண்ணங்களுக்கும் "மடிந்து", விடைக்கொடுத்து மறுவாழ்வடைய உயிர்த்தெமுவோம்.

துறவிகளாகிய நாம், கொன்சாகா குடும்பத்தின் அன்பு உறவுகளைப் பேணுவோம், நமது குழுமங்களில் மூவொரு கடவுளின் ஒன்றிணைப்பும், திருக்குடும்ப வாழ்வின் முன்மாதிரியும் மிளிரட்டும். சகோதரிகள் எல்லோரும் நிம்மதியையும், அமைதியையும், சமாதானத்தையும் அள்ளி பருகட்டும்.

இயேசுவின் உயிர்ப்புக்கு பின் ஆவியானவரின் உறுதுணையால், வழிகாட்டலால் அதிசங்களையும், அற் புதங் களையும் திருத் தூதர் களால் செய்ய முடிந் தது, எண்ணற்றோரை இயேசுவின் உண்மைப்பாதையில் நடக்க வைக்க முடிந்தது. எனவே, அன்பு சகோதரமே நம் சபையின் தொன்மை மிகுந்த, மரபுப் பணியான திருத்தூதுப்பணியை ஒவ்வொரு சகோதரியும் உயிர் மூச்சாக நினைத்து செய்வோம். வீதியெங்கும் செல்வோம், குடும்பங்களை சந்திப்போம், உயிர்த்த இயேசுவின் ஆசீரை கொண்டு செல்வோம், இயேசு தரும் சமாதானத்தை, அமைதியை குழுமங்களில், குடும்பங்களில் விதைப்போம்.

## The voice of the heart.....

#### My Dear, Lovable, and Affectionate Mothers and Beloved Sisters,

May the Peace of the Risen Lord be with you all!

On this glorious Easter, we remember how the disciples initially struggled to believe the truth of the Resurrection. Mary Magdalene, who visited the tomb early in the morning, became the first witness to the rolled-away stone. Though her message of the empty tomb was met with doubt, Peter and John hurried to see for themselves. In their haste, the younger disciple waited for the elder, reminding us that the wisdom of those who came before us is a precious gift. When they entered, they saw the empty tomb—proof that Jesus, who was buried, had indeed risen!

As we celebrate the glorious Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us reflect on the profound encounter between Mary Magdalene and the Risen Savior. Heartbroken and weeping outside the empty tomb, Mary did not recognize Jesus at first. The Resurrected Lord tenderly asked her, "Why are you crying? Who are you looking for?" Thinking He was the gardener, she pleaded with Him—until He spoke her name, "Mary". At once, she knew it was her Lord. Overwhelmed with joy, she cried out, "Rabboni!" (meaning "Teacher") and reached to hold Him. But Jesus said, "Do not hold on to Me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. Go instead to My brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to My God and your God.' "In this divine moment, Jesus chose Mary Magdalene as the first messenger of His Resurrection—entrusting her with the sacred duty of evangelization. Thus, she became not only a devoted follower but also the first woman disciple commissioned by Christ Himself to proclaim the Good News.

Celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus in Glory!
Death is swallowed up in Victory,
The grave is broken, Victory is Won!!
Truth never sleeps—Justice never dies.
For Truth lives, and Justice reigns eternal!"

The Resurrection of Jesus calls us to face life's challenges with courage and hope! By rising from the dead, Christ shattered the chains of fear and opened the way to true freedom. At first, even His disciples were afraid—hiding behind locked doors like ordinary people. But when they encountered the Risen Lord, everything changed. Filled with the Holy Spirit, they boldly proclaimed: 'Jesus Christ is Lord! He has risen from the dead, just as He said!

The disciples boldly proclaimed Jesus as the Lamb of God wherever they went. Filled with courage, they embraced suffering rather than hiding from it, enduring hardships with unwavering faith. Though lies and injustice may seem like obstacles in our lives, they will ultimately come to nothing for truth and righteousness prevail.

In His Thirty-three years on earth, Jesus did only good. He spoke out against injustice, confronted wrongdoing, and fiercely declared the equality of all people. He taught humanity how to live with compassion, integrity, and love. Most importantly, He lived what He preached and preached what He lived a life of perfect consistency.

The religious and political authorities of the time the Pharisees, Sadducees, Scribes, and Romans believed that by crucifying Jesus, they could silence His teachings and end His influence. But they were gravely mistaken. Though He was crucified, died, and was buried in a borrowed tomb, His resurrection ignited a fire that spread faster than ever before. Like a seed buried deep in the ground, Christianity after Jesus' resurrection took root, grew, and flourished into a mighty tree, spreading its truth and grace across the earth.

Whenever we courageously stand for truth and righteousness whenever we raise our voices against injustice for the oppressed and the broken, we too may face harsh judgment, persecution, or even the

threat of death. There will be moments when fear tightens our throats, when darkness seems overwhelming.

But remember this: Just as Christ triumphed over the cross, His resurrection assures us that no sacrifice made in His name is in vain. When we stand against evil, we share in His suffering-but we also share in His victory. The world may try to silence us, but God will raise our cause, just as He raised His Son.

Dear sisters, the same power that brought Jesus back from the grave is at work in you. Every act of faith, every cry for justice, and every step taken in love is a seed planted for eternity and in God's time, it will rise—unstoppable, unshaken, and radiant with His glory.

The 'stone' covering the cemetery within our stony or lifeless hearts must be overturned in our lives so that we may fully rejoice in the joy of Jesus' Resurrection. Indeed, those who help us turn over this stone—our well-wishers, congregation administrators, the constitution and rules of our congregation, general team resolutions, the Superiors of the convent, senior sisters, formators, and spiritual directors—are instruments of grace. They open the tombs of our hardened hearts, calling us to deep reflection and transformation. Through their guidance and God's mercy, may we embrace this resurrection with faith and gratitude. Let us, therefore, die to our old sinful ways and thoughts, rising anew from our past into the renewed life Christ offers.



The Mandalay Diocese was among the worst affected areas, where several Franciscan Sisters of St. Aloysius Gonzaga (FSAG) communities suffered notable losses.

In particular, the communities in Mandalay, Meikthila, and Tharsi witnessed the collapse of





numerous sacred statues and visible structural damage to the convent buildings. The physical destruction mirrored the emotional impact on the sisters and the local faithful, who faced the aftermath with courage and prayer.

Moved by the urgency and gravity of the situation, Sr. Maria Eulalia, Provincial Superior, accompanied by Sr. Elizabeth Htwe, Provincial Procurator, undertook a pastoral visit to each of the affected convents. Their presence brought



not only leadership and guidance but also deep spiritual solace to the communities reeling from the quake's impact.

Among all, the Yamethin region bore the most severe destruction. The parish church was extensively damaged, and much of the area was left in ruins. The devastation was both physical and symbolic, as sacred spaces were reduced to rubble.

In a remarkable act of Christian charity and

interfaith compassion, Sr. Maria Eulalia and Sr. Elizabeth Htwe extended their outreach beyond their own communities. They journeyed to nearby Buddhist villages, many of which were among the most severely affected. There, with hearts open and hands full, they offered essential supplies and monetary donations to the victims—regardless of faith or background.

Their actions exemplified the true Franciscan spirit—a spirit of love, service, and solidarity with the suffering. In moments of profound loss, they became beacons of hope, bringing comfort not only through material support but through their presence, prayers, and unwavering commitment to the dignity of every human life.

This moment of tragedy has revealed, once again, the strength and compassion that define the mission of our sisters. Through faith in action, we continue to reflect the light of Christ in a wounded world.



## Chosen in Spirit: The Sacred Journey of Michael Ansaldo

#### Messina: The Sacred Cradle of Divine Providence

Before Michael Ansaldo answered the call to spiritual service, his soul was shaped by the divine providence of Messina, a city whose beauty and sanctity prepared him for a life of profound spiritual devotion. Messina, where the Tyrrhenian Sea kisses the shores and the mountains stands as silent witness to eternity, became the holy birthplace of his divine vocation. Here, in this sacred place, the eternal dance of creation - earth, sea, and sky - revealed to Ansaldo the profound harmony of God's will.

In Messina, the very air was infused with the scent of salt and citrus, while the streets whispered ancient truths of divine wisdom. The city became more than a geographical location - it was the crucible where Ansaldo's soul was first awakened to the truth of God's grace. Born on September 29, 1739, to Emmanuele Ansaldo and Maria Anna Gaudioso, Ansaldo's early years in this holy city formed the foundation for his divine calling to a life of service, grace, and eternal love.

#### **MESSINA**

#### The Divine Invitation: Michael Ansaldo's Sacred Novitiate

At 15, Michael Ansaldo experienced a profound awakening - a divine summon to dedicate his life to God. Answering this call, he and his elder brother, Joseph Maria Ansaldo, officially entered the Society of Jesus on January 15, 1754, at the Novitiate in Messina under the guidance of Rev. Fr. Simone Castiglia, SJ. This decision was not merely a change in direction but a complete surrender to divine providence, embracing the Jesuit way of life.

The novitiate marked the beginning of Michael Ansaldo's spiritual formation - a period of purification, prayer, and reflection. Through trials and disciplines, his connection with God deepened, strengthening his resolve to serve humanity wholeheartedly. As a Jesuit Scholastic, after Novitiate, Michael Ansaldo was sent to do philosophical and theological studies as preparation for ordination and perpetual vows.



#### First Profession and Academic Formation

On January 16, 1756, Michael and Joseph made their first profession pronouncing the Perpetual Vows of Poverty, Chastity and Obedience. In 1758, Ansaldo began his rhetorical studies, followed by three years of philosophical studies (1759 - 1762). He then commenced his theological training in 1763 at the Auditores Theologiae Cursus Maioris. In 1765, both the brothers pursued their first year of theology at Massimo College in Palermo. While Michael continued his studies there until 1767, Joseph completed his second and third years in Messina.



#### **Intellectual and Spiritual Formation**

As mastery of classical languages - Latin, English, French, and Spanish - was essential, Ansaldo, known linguistic aptitude, excelled in these languages.

Following the principles of the Ratio Studiorum, young Jesuits engaged in

rigorous academic training, including "loud reading" to enhance comprehension and retention. Through perseverance and intellectual rigor, Ansaldo achieved academic excellence, embodying the Jesuit ideal of uniting knowledge with faith in service to God. His journey through the novitiate and beyond instilled in him a profound spirit of obedience and humility, shaping him into a devoted servant of Christ, committed to the mission of the Society of Jesus.


